*The Seventh Annual C. Everett Koop, MD Tobacco Treatment Conference: Moving the Koop Legacy Forward* will include essential current topics to address emerging challenges clinicians deal with when treating tobacco users in their daily clinical practice. Richard D. Hurt, MD, is an internationally recognized expert on evidence-based tobacco dependence treatment research and education. He is founder and director of the Mayo Clinic Nicotine Dependence Center in Rochester, MN, Emeritus Professor of Medicine College of Medicine Mayo Clinic and Emeritus Chair of Global Bridges. Dr. Hurt will present on the Neurobiology of Addiction and the Global Endgame approach to the tobacco epidemic. The range of issues to be presented includes: updated evidence for Low Density CT Screening for Lung Cancer, insightful Motivational Interviewing strategies for challenging clients, how clinicians can respond to ENDS users and insight into what influences clinicians decision making when treating tobacco users.
